Barn Hype in Kandiyohi County

Little Crow Photography Club has been working in conjunction with the Kandiyohi County Historical Society on a project concerning barns in the county. Club members volunteered to photograph various barns in the county. The shoot was organized by townships (24 in total), with a club member volunteering to capture barn images in an assigned township. In Arctander Township alone, 25 Barns have been photographed to date and there are probably 5 to 10 more that could be shot. Many of them are "working" barns since they are being used for dairy or for the purposes of housing livestock or hay storage. There are numerous situations where the barn is being used by the fourth generation of the family.

In Colfax Township, there is a barn constructed in 2000 by the old time tested methods. All timbers were rough cut at a local saw-

mill—taken there by the owner and his Percheron horses. The timbers are fastened together with wooden pegs and mortise joints. A tremendous amount of hand work!

All the "barn hype" is due to the fact that a Smithsonian Institution traveling exhibit, "Barn Again," will be at the Kandiyohi County Historical Society Museum from May 9 through June 17. Our club's photographs will be exhibited in conjunction with the Smithsonian Exhibit.

On April 29 at 7 p.m., at our club meeting (at Dethlef Center, Spicer Minnesota), Doug Ohman will be presenting "The Heart of the Farm," in conjunction with a book signing for his book, *Barns In Minnesota*, which is published by the Minnesota Historical Society and set for release in April. Ohman's photographs are featured with text by Will Weaver.

FYI from Barb Smith—Ken Visser, who owns 400 acres northwest of Willmar, reports he has noticed that the pasque flowers are out now.

Photography Workshop and Buggy Print Photography Contest for Kids

On Thursday, June 30, at 1:00 p.m., kids ages 8-12 can learn photography at the Maple Grove Library. The Twin Cities Area Council of Camera Clubs and the Friends of the Maple Grove Library are co-sponsoring this event. Kids are to bring their camera for a hands-on workshop to learn how to take great bug pictures. The workshop will cover: how a camera works, how to photograph bugs without harming them, tips and techniques on taking good pictures, examples of bug pictures from local photographers.

Participants can then enter their bug photo in the Maple Grove Buggy Print Photography Contest. This, too, is co-sponsored by the Twin Cities Area Council of Camera Clubs and the Friends of the Maple Grove Library.

Entries in the Buggy Print Photography Contest are due Monday, July 25. Again, people ages 8-12 can enter their 4x6, 5x7, or 8x10 (no larger) bug picture (prints only) in the buggy photography contest. One entry per person per category. Categories are:

- 1) most colorful,
- 2) ugliest,
- 3) most legs,
- 4) cutest.

Participants will be given entry instructions. Cash prizes will be awarded for each category:

- \$10 first place,
- \$5 second place,
- \$5 third place.

Entries will be submitted by Monday, July 25. Judging will take place on Thursday, August 4, 1-4 p.m.

A Voice Within debuted at the Tweed Museum of Art and then was the inaugural exhibit at the new Minnesota Center for Photography. It has been featured in the local media including the *Minneapolis Star Tribune*, KARE 11, *Minnesota Monthly*, and *Lake Superior Magazine*, as well as internationally in *View Camera*, *Outdoor Photographer*, *N*, and *American Photo*.

Russel Hart of *American Photo* said, "Blacklock's pictures are some of the most beautifully conceived and sumptuously reproduced examples of the genre we've seen. The work picks up where Edward Weston left off."
